THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI KANTI SINGH): (a) National Commission for Women (NCW) has informed that there is no statistical data available to prove that Section 498-A of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) is being misused by women to harass their in-laws.

(b) and (c) Do not arise.

(d) In terms of Section 398-A of the IPC, if a person being the husband or the relative of the husband of a woman subjects her to cruelty, he can be held guilty of offence under the said Section. Subjecting the woman to cruelty at any time during the marriage is culpable under this Section.

(b) whether there have been any provisions to crack down on physical sexual, verbal and economic abuse on women;

(c) whether the Bill covers harassment by way of unlawful dowry demands; and

(d) the provisions made under the new legislation to give women rights to share household properties?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI KANTI SINGH): (a) The Bill is proposed to be introduced in Lok Sabha in Monsoon Session, 2005.

(b) and (c) Yes, Sir.

(d) The Bill provides that notwithstanding anything contained in any other law for the time being in force, every woman in a domestic

relationship shall have the right to reside in the shared household, whether or not she has any right, title or beneficial interest in the same. It is further provided that the aggrieved person shall not be evicted or excluded from the shared household or any part of it by the respondent save in accordance with the procedure established by law.
